A Note from the President

ASJMC: Your lifeline.

Sometimes your best option is to "phone a friend."

"Phone-a-friend" famously offered a "lifeline" for stumped contestants on "Who Wants to Be a Millionaire." If a contestant didn't know the answer or lacked confidence in their answer, they could call a friend for help or affirmation.

When I need to phone a friend, I often dial Dr. Raul Reis, ASJMC past president and Dean of the Hussman School of Journalism and Media at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, whom I first met in 2018 at the ASJMC workshop/conference.

Outside of ASJMC, I don't believe our professional paths would have crossed. Although we worked in the same discipline for more than a decade and both attended AEJMC, I had never met Dr. Reis. Today, it's hard to imagine the past five years without Dr. Reis's support.

If you are managing difficult personnel matters, navigating the impact of a new budget model, leading a unit through reaccreditation, or simply trying to make it through a particularly tough semester, an ASJMC colleague often offers the best lifeline.

You'll most likely find someone, such as Dr. Reis, who has been there, done that. Your trusted ASJMC colleagues bring the experience and offer the insight to help you avoid pitfalls and capitalize on promising situations.

There are some things you simply can't discuss with anyone inside your university and maintain confidentiality. Without an outside support network of discrete, experienced professional peers, you may feel isolated in your role.

Isolation impedes success, but community promotes excellence. The support of a network of peers who are familiar with the unique demands of a leadership position in journalism and mass communication administration can be professionally and personally invaluable.

Aside from the outstanding informal opportunities for connection afforded by ASJMC to support its leaders, the Association offers professional leadership development through the annual conference and this year's first-ever "pre-conference."

ASJMC's two-day workshop/conference, which takes place every spring, marks a much-anticipated annual highlight. The annual workshop gives administrators the opportunity to discuss timely, salient issues, hear from expert panelists, take respite with colleagues, build relationships, and gain renewed perspective to support their success.

The conference theme will be "Managing Change." Three major sub-themes will highlight processes related to ASJMC's mission and involved in change management: (1) Supporting leaders, (2) Organizing resources, and (3) Activating innovation.

This year's conference occurs on March 21 and 22. The upcoming pre-conference on March 20 will focus on professional leadership development. The pre-conference and conference will be hosted at the Westin Michigan Avenue Chicago preceding the ACEJMC Committee Meeting March 22 and 23.

If you are attending the ASJMC Conference and ACEJMC Committee Meeting, you should plan to be in Chicago March 20-23. In the past, the two events for JMC leaders were scheduled within weeks of one another, but in different cities. The back-to-back scheduling presents a great opportunity for you to attend both important events at a savings of time and money.

The moment demands an organized community of strong academic leaders and professional experts to seize the opportunities and overcome the challenges facing our discipline.

The Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communications (ACEJMC) will conduct its annual Committee meeting in March in collaboration with ASJMC's winter workshop.

ACEJMC encourages directors attending the ASJMC workshop to stay a day or two longer at the Westin Hotel to attend the ACEJMC Committee meeting, which begins Friday afternoon, March 22, and continues all day Saturday, March 23. The 15-member Committee is ex-

pected to vote on accreditation recommendations from site teams reviewing programs at 27 universities.
